Hello! It's been a few months since you last received a Scoop so let me catch you up on what your COA & Director have been working on this summer. July 1st marked the beginning of our new fiscal year, which means a new budget and a new year of events to plan. I have been working on putting together a monthly information session for the remaining months of 2019 and I'm already starting to think ahead to next years events. If you have a topic that interests you, or you think would be of interest to others, please let the COA know! We do our best to look for presenters or activities that you might like, but we can always use your suggestions! In fact, we need them in order to give you programming that you will enjoy and value. Remember, the COA meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 3:30 at the Town Hall.

September triggers a few things here at the COA. We will soon be applying for 2 grants. The first is for funding from the State's office of Elder Affairs which is called the "Formula Grant". This grant is based on the town's senior population and we apply for it every year. Last year the amount awarded to Ashby was \$6,000. We use those funds for Director's pay and to mail the newsletter each month. The other grant we typically apply for is through the Mass Cultural Council's Local Cultural Council (LCC) Program . Last year we used those awarded funds to host a presentation on bird songs of the northeast, and singer Lisa Yves the year before that. We are always looking for suggestions for performers to use those LCC grant funds and we welcome your suggestions and ideas! Remember, the COA meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 3:30 at the Town Hall. Our next meeting is September 11th at 3:30, third floor of the town hall. We strongly encourage you all to join us! Hope to see you there!


