Dear Ashby,

The past few months have been very busy for your COA. The next month leading up to the Annual Town Meeting will prove to be just as busy. Members of the COA and I have attended every Board of Selectmen's Meeting and Finance Committee meeting since the end of January in an effort to make sure the Ashby Council on Aging is appropriately funded in fiscal year 2020. The COA is requesting an increase in the number of paid hours for the COA Director position. I covered the details of that request in the last newsletter so I won't bore you by repeating it all again here.

There are many Selectman and Finance Committee meetings between now and the Town Meeting in May when Ashby will vote to approve the FY2020 budget. The COA and I plan to be at each and every one of those meetings to continue the open dialogue between the COA and our town officials, and to ensure that the COA is adequately funded. Tuesday, April 30th @ 1:00 at the Ashby Free Public Library



Take a Book - If you see something you'd like to read, take it. When you're done, bring it back, pass it along, or donate it to a library.


Share a Book - Donate a book or two that you no longer need.



Ashby P.D. Tip of the Month

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU FIND A DISCARDED SYRINGE:

As the snow begins to melt, most of us welcome the chance to emerge from our homes to embrace the spring weather. The reality of the snow melting also presents a potential danger along the roadside, the litter of syringes improperly discarded the last few months. Due to the current opiate epidemic we have seen an increase in discarded syringes throughout our community the last few years. This is an unfortunate reality of todays society and everyone must be



extremely careful when dealing with these items.

If you discover a syringe along the roadway **DO NOT TOUCH IT** and **contact the Ashby Police Department**. If you are unable to remain at the location of the syringe please provide the dispatcher with an accurate location so an Officer may retrieve and properly dispose of it. **We can not stress enough the importance of not touching the syringe**. The risk of being stuck by an uncapped needle and contracting a potential disease is a real possibility. The Tip of the Month is prepared by Ashby Police Officer Erik Salo (pictured left). Officer Salo began his civilian law enforcement career in 1998 by attending the reserve police academy in Waltham. During this time Officer Salo has worked for various police agencies including: Fitchburg State University PD, Westminster PD and Shirley PD. Officer Salo was promoted to a full time Patrolman for the Town of Ashby in January 2017. Prior to his civilian police career Officer Salo served as a Military Policeman in the US Army from 1990-1996.

NEWS FROM SHINE:

THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVELS HAVE INCREASED

As a result of increases to the Federal Poverty Level, Eligibility Guidelines for Public Benefits Programs in Massachusetts have changed. MassHealth has increased the income limits for several programs you may be eligible for. The income to be eligible for MassHealth Standard has increased from \$1,012 for a single person to \$1,041, for a married couple it has gone up to from \$1,372 to \$1,410 . For another popular program MassHealth Buy-in (this would pay your Medicare Part B Premium) the eligibility income has gone up from \$1,366 to \$1,406 for a single person, and from \$1,852 to \$1,903 for a couple. These increases also apply to Full Extra Help a program from Social Security that helps pay for your medications. You can qualify for Partial Extra Help if your income is below \$1,561 for a single person and \$2,114 for a married couple. If you feel you may be eligible under these new income guidelines feel free to call the ASHBY COA to schedule a meeting with Ashby's SHINE Program Counselor.

The SHINE Program (Serving the Health Insurance Needs of Everyone) is a State Health Insurance Assistance program that provides free health insurance information and counseling assistance to Massachusetts residents with Medicare and their families.
