## A Message from Ashby's New Animal Inspector, April Alden

Hi everyone, I've taken the animal inspector position in Ashby. I was nominated by the Board of Health and appointed by the State. Barn Inspections have not been done in quite a while so it may seem odd to folks why someone is coming around now. I've been met with mostly support but some peoples reactions have been more like, what did I do?! I TOTALLY understand! I want to assure you I'm not a weirdo. I live here in town and run Souhegan Farm on West Rd. I've worked there for 19 years and come with a very long resume of animal experience. Every town in MA is required to have an animal inspector. The Division of Animal Health has been collecting information on the numbers of domestic animals and their locations around the state. The collection of



data is used to develop a response plan to an emergency and implement it. The info is used to assist people who may find themselves unable to get their animals clear of a potentially dangerous situation. I have to inspect every property housing livestock, including horses and chickens. The location of the animals is pin pointed on computer generated maps and is used in planning disease control or natural disaster response. The inspections are designed to ensure the safety of everyone's animals, is confidential, and will only be used to develop emergency response plans. Recently the duties of animals inspector has also been made to include rabies control and management of dog/cat bites to humans, other domestic animals, and wild animals. My visit to your farm is easy - a visual inspection of the animals and their conditions. I want to make contact with people first instead of just showing up. I've already done 35 visits so far. I'm really nice and easy to deal with - I promise! I am calling folks to introduce myself and set up times to meet them in person. If you'd like to ask me any questions, or set up a time for me to visit, you can call or text me.




#### ASHBY MART SHUTTLE SERVICE

Were you aware that the Ashby Police Department will check your house **while you are away**? A uniformed police officer will check the exterior of your house while

you are away for an extended period of time (vacation, extended hospital stays, etc.). The officer will ensure that the house has not been broken in to or vandalized by checking doors and windows. This is a FREE service that is provided by the police department and often underutilized by the citizens of Ashby.


