

SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX WORK-OFF PROGRAM

This program allows Ashby homeowners, age 65+ to reduce property taxes by up to \$600 per year by working for the Town of Ashby.

- Applicant must meet eligibility requirements, must have appropriate skills and physical ability for position, and the Applicant and Department Head must both agree the job is an appropriate match;



THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVELS HAVE INCREASED:

As a result of increases to the Federal Poverty Level, Eligibility Guidelines for Public Benefits Programs in Massachusetts have changed. MassHealth has increased the income limits for several programs you may be eligible for. The income to be eligible for MassHealth **Standard** has increased from \$1,025 for a single person to \$1,032, for a married couple it has gone up to \$1,392 from \$1,374. For another popular program MassHealth **Buy-in (this would pay your Medicare Part B Premium)** the eligibility income has gone up to \$1,386 from \$1,377 for a single person and from \$1,847 to \$1,872 for a couple. These increases also apply to **Full Extra Help** a program from Social Security that helps pay for your medications. You can qualify for **Partial Extra Help** if your income is below \$1,538 for a single person and \$2,078 for a married couple. If you feel you may be eligible under these new income guidelines feel free to call the COA office to schedule a meeting with Ashby's SHINE councilor for more information.
